SHIRE NEWS - ROMSEY RIDING:

At last month's meeting a walkway, proposed to give pedestrian access from Wrixon Street through to a future subdivision, has been re-opened for discussion and consideration because of the objection from a neighbouring property owner. The walkway would give access to properties planned for the area west of Wrixon Street, rather than a longer walk to Barry Street and down to the town.

A planning permit application for the erection and strata subdivision of two units was refused. The location was on the corner of Metcalfe Drive and Barry Street.

An application for a "Granny Flat" to be erected behind a dwelling in White Avenue has been advertised. The flat is to be a larger dwelling than the usual flat we are accustomed to, hence the advertising.

SHIRE NEWS (cont.)

Our Health Surveyor has met with Officers of several adjoining Shires to discuss the possibility of a Regional approach to re-cycling. All representatives agreed to defer the matter as the sale of nearly all collected recyclables had just about stopped. It was generally felt that all councils should express concern to local politicians and concerned bodies, and a further meeting will be held in February to re-assess the situation.

December will be the last meeting of Council for Councillor Smith as she and her family are relocating to Queensland in early January. An election for the Romsey Riding will be held in early February, so at no time will Rosmeay be without three representatives.

IN YOUR ROMSEY GARDEN:
 Garden Post Control Pt.4.: As mentioned in previous articles in this series, there are no biological controls available here to control many pests and diseases. It is therefore encouraging to note the progress in this direction being made overseas as indicated in the following extract from Australian Garden Journal of April/May this year: "More than 1300 laboratories have been established in the USSR for producing biocontrols, which are now in use on almost 90 million acres of farms and glasshouses. Predator mites and insects are being produced for the control of red spider mites, whiteflies, aphids and thrips. In addition, a potent biological control, trichoderma, made from a soil dwelling fungus, has been found to control many plant diseases, including powdery mildew. A leaf beetle and a cutworm are being used to control ragweed, and a fusarium fungus and a parasitic fly to control another major weed, Egyptian broomrape." From the same source it is noted that: "The University of Illinois has developed an insecticide which combines an amino acid and a chemical modulator, so that insects which are sprayed with the substance quickly die when exposed to light. This insecticide is biodegradable and is said to be safe. It is also believed that insects are unlikely to develop a resistance to it.

THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION VISITS ROMSEY PRIMARY SCHOOL:

Due to the frustrations experienced in achieving the development of the new Romsey Primary School complex, the School Council determined to take their case to the Minister. We were particularly pleased that the Minister was able to visit with us, on site, last Thursday afternoon. During this meeting members of the School Council received a sympathetic hearing from the Minister, and an assurance that, given continued Federal funding assistance and the high priority given to this project by the Regional Office, the actual construction stage could commence as soon as the State budget and Capital works projects are announced next year.

The Councillors aimed to gain a commitment of support from the Minister and an assurance that construction would actually commence during the next financial year. We were all pleased with the hearing we received and the assurances gained.

NEW SCHOOL DEVELOPMENTS:

On Wednesday of this week our Architect, Mr Peter Jones, will display the floor plans for the new complex. The Master Plans are currently displayed at the school and we will be constructing new pin boards in the school passageway, on which the plans can be displayed.
