

ARCHIVIST HONOURED.

Mrs Dorothy Viney, archivist at the Lancefield Court House Museum, has been made a Life Member of the Romsey and Lancefield Districts Historical Society Inc.. Dorothy undertook the work of archivist ten years ago and has made an outstanding effort in caring for the society records and answering the many enquiries received for information, particularly regarding family and genealogical research. President of the Society, Robert Clement, said that this honour was not given lightly, there are only three other Life Members, when congratulating Mrs Viney on her achievements.

Information on some of the historic buildings in Romsey and Lancefield is being collected with a view to publishing a simple guide so that their importance may be better appreciated by visitors and residents. Initially this guide will cover the town centres to form a comfortable walking tour to view the buildings and other historic sites.

On Friday, May 31, an evening meal will be served in a hall, when people will be invited to bring along an interesting object, to discuss with others. More activities are planned for later in the year.

The Royal Historical Society of Victoria has adjusted the boundaries of its regions to bring them in to line with the new municipalities. The Macedon Ranges societies are now joined with Bendigo, Castlemaine, Maldon, Harcourt, and Huntly. Mrs Janet Hawkins of the Woodend Heritage Society is the State Committee delegate for this region. The RHSV will hold an Open Day at the Royal Mint, corner of LaTrobe and William Streets in Melbourne, on Sunday 5 May. An interesting and varied program is planned, including a monster book sale, tours of the Royal Mint, Flagstaff Gardens, and St James Old Cathedral, plant and preserves stalls and refreshments.

Several new members were welcomed at the last society meeting. We trust that they will enjoy their association with the group. The next meeting will be held at Seymour Cottage, Palmer Street, Romsey, at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, April 23.

AES has been operating its outreach office in Romsey for just on a year now, and as Colleen Morrow has moved back to the Sunbury office this year, I am taking this opportunity to introduce myself, and to keep you up to date with our activities.

My name is Ruth Curnow, I have been with Able Service for about five years, working out of our Glenroy office for the last three years. I currently have about six people jobsearching and/or receiving employment support through the Romsey office, but can certainly cope with more, so if you have a disability and are interested in gaining employment, I would be interested to discuss it with you.

For six months last year Colleen supported three young people who participated in the Romsey "Bungawitta" LEAP Restoration Project. They all gained a lot of valuable experience from the project and are now very focused regarding their future employment.

Early in April we moved our office to the Shire Offices, so you will now find us through the double doors at the front of the Shire Offices. The phone number (054) 29 6608 remains the same.

AES has expanded during the last few months, employing more staff in Glenroy. Mike Anderson has recently become our new Employment Manager, having previously been the general manager of Goulburn Valley Work Trainers, based in Shepparton, central Victoria for the last six years. We also now have another Marketing officer, Rob Paladino will be working with me in marketing for this area.

In the near future, AES will be changing its name to EmployABILITY (250 services throughout Australia will be using this name in the future).

Everyone knows someone who either has a disibility and might benefit from our service, or who is an employer thinking of taking on another employee. Either way I would be interested to hear from you.

OBITUARY: Violet Christine Frost:

Funeral Service was at St. Paul's Romsey, followed by a burial in Lancefield Cemetery.

Born in 1911, in Mordialloc, Violet was one of five children who were to be brought up under fairly difficult conditions after their father William died.

She began her long working life at the age of 15 and for 5 years worked as a telephone switch operator and typist. In 1931 she was one of the many people who lost their positions because of the effects of the depression.

During subsequent years she found work as a domestic/housekeeper as well as assisting her mother

bringing up the family.

In 1941 Violet married Stan Frost and became a farmers wife. She adapted her skills to a new life and became part of the local community of Kerrie. She later worked with Stan in a produce store at Woodend. After selling that business she moved on to Strath Creek with Stan to become the local Postmistress and joint storekeeper. She contributed willingly to community activities in the area, living an extremely busy life caring for her family as well.

Retirement to Broadford in 1975 gave Violet a welcome relief from a long and hardworking life. She had fulfilled the words of an employer written in 1937 - she had been "Willing Courteous,

honest, she had performed her duties with the utmost satisfaction".

These words really applied to all of her of course. Her family can attest to her concern, care and love for them from near or afar. Her patience, her sense of humour and fortitude as well as her ability to make the most of all situations in which she found herself are an example for us all to follow. Her influence will be with us all for the years to come.

An example of her sense of humour and being able to adapt to any situation. Before dinner at night she would be asked "Would you like a glass of water or a beer maybe a wine or even a sherry" Her

answer "Yes Please".

Now, as quoted from her employer in 1937, "She leaves us, on her own accord, which I sincerely regret." Rev. Paul Wood



THE COMMON COLD

We have all suffered from colds and know how miserable these infections can make you feel. Colds can be caused by a number of different viruses and the symptoms may vary depending on the particular virus and the individual's response to that virus. Colds occur more frequently in winter but can strike at any time of the year.

Children are particularly susceptible to colds as they have not yet developed much resistance to them. When children are in contact with a lot of infections, they may have six to eight colds per year, while adults may have three to four or even less.

With all infections, you are more susceptible when you are run down or have not been eating well. Although while a healthy diet is important, there is no proof that vitamin supplements help to prevent colds.

Most colds begin with a feeling of tiredness, sore throat and maybe a headache or aching in the muscles. Children in particular may have a fever at this stage. After a few days these symptoms settle, but by then the nose is often congested and a cough may shortly follow. At this stage, you generally feel a bit better. The stuffy nose usually settles before the cough, which may continue for up to a couple of weeks.

Antibiotics do not work against viruses. Most settle by themselves in time and all that is required is rest, lots of fluids and perhaps medications to ease the symptoms until they go away by themselves.

INFLUENZA

Influenza is caused by different viruses to a cold and is usually more severe, particularly in older people and those with kidney or liver disease, diabetes and heart or lung problems such as asthma, emphysema and chronic bronchitis. For these people, and those with a suppressed immune system, vaccination against the flu before winter each year will prevent this infection.

The Romsey Medical Centre will have some flu vaccination sessions on April 23rd and 26th. You may book an appointment for these sessions by ringing the medical centre. Just before your appointment you will be required to purchase your flu injection from the chemist and bring this with you. The doctor's consultation for these sessions will be bulk billed.



A Farm Safety Program will be held in the Watts Pavilion at the Kyneton Showgrounds on Saturday, April 13, 9am. to 12.30pm.

The program is being put on by the Country Women's Association, the Kyneton Branch of the Victorian Farmers' Federation, Cobaw Community Health, and the Health and Safety Organisation. A barbecue will follow for all who attend and all is free.

Farming is a dangerous business, yet many who work in the industry do not acknowledge this. They believe that accidents happen only to others. They do not see that for them the home and the work place are side by side and intertwined, not as in urban areas where vulnerable people can be kept separate from dangerous places.

The program recognises that both men, women and children live on farms, and will have many interesting and important safety messages including safety with tractors, chemicals, electricity, the handling of animals, storage of dangerous goods such as guns and chemicals. Also included in the program will be safety with the person, including exposure to chemicals, the weather. A speaker will consider the impact of a serious or fatal farm incident on the farm family and neighbours. Another speaker will talk of the capacity women and children have to absorb the safety message and reinforce it again and again in the home. Everyone can learn to make their property a safer place both for their family and visitors.


