

February in the garden

Finally, some hot weather! It took the plants a few weeks to respond – the cucumber eventually took off and so has the basil. However, the tomatoes were so delayed by the cool wet spring, they still hadn't set any fruit by mid-January. But at least they are growing now.

The lawn looks lush and green, and its first watering wasn't needed until mid-January. That's most unusual. The desert willow-catalpa hybrid (X Chitalpa) has been delayed by about a month, but it is finally covered in gorgeous pale pink azalea-like flowers. The honeyeaters have just discovered them! My red cannas have been the slowest of all. They are only now producing buds in mid-January.

The agapanthus (all cultivars) are also late, as are some of the salvias.

I've been potting up some of my succulents particularly the ones that are growing actively now like agave and echeverias. I had a tussle with a large tree-aloe and as it was in a tulip shaped pot (bad idea I know) I had to resort to blasting the potting mix out with a hose. Its now in a new straight-sided pot so it will be easier to get out next time. I also removed the three aerial layers I created on the purple cordyline. I did these six months ago and each cut through the bark and wrapped with sphagnum moss and plastic produced roots! Now I just have to keep them alive until they form enough roots to support what is



basically a giant cutting. In my little propagation house, some palm seeds have germinated!
I picked the seeds up from beneath the palms outside the Treasury Buildings in Spring St. I think they are Washingtonia palms – the really tall ones – maybe Washingtonia robusta. Hopefully they will be quite cold tolerant in the Macedon Ranges!

Romsey Rag February 2023

Over the years, all Australians have been asked to pay a little extra to help solve a problem in another area. For many years the tax payers of Victoria and New South Wales helped pay for programs and works in the other, less populated states. We all pay a waterways levy with our water bill and many pay a fire levy. In most cases we do not get too upset about this as we all know that we are all Australians and that we often have to work together to get a good result.

Recently many Romsey and surrounding districts' residents will have received their Greater Western Water account. Part of that paperwork was a flyer announcing a number of things. One of these announcements was that \$35 million dollars had been allocated to improving the Gisborne Recycled Water Plant. In the last few years Romsey has seen some work done on street-side piping but virtually nothing in relation to the the main supply to the town and more importantly to the under sized re-cycled water works.

Romsey is expanding steadily, and more pressure is, and will continue to be, put on this facility.

The development in and around Romsey has been well known for many years. It would have been clear that the existing facility would have great difficulty in handling this additional waste water. In the past we have seen the Environment Protection Authority reacting to category C water being released into Deep Creek.

We generally don't mind helping others out but it is hard to accept this expenditure when the obvious needs of Romsey and surrounding districts appear to have been seriously neglected.



Method

- Place oven rack in centre of oven,
 Preheat oven 220 line tray with foil of baking paper.
- 2. Wash and dry Zucchini and cut into ¼ in slices. Arrange zucchini rounds on the prepared pan with little or no space between them. Sprinkle with garlic salt and pepper. Spread a thin layer of parmesan on each zucchini slice.
- 3. Bake 15-20 mins or until Parmesan turns a light golden brown.
- 4. Serve immediately.



Cooking with Peter Russell-Clarke

One would imagine St. Valentine would entertain his latest conquest with a sexy dish of figs with honey, or bananas, or pears, but I'm told he didn't waste time with such banal foreplay. So I've decided the Rabbit should be my symbol for St. Valentine's Day.

Jan and I moved from the Bellarine Peninsula to Central Victoria. The town of Tooborac is just down the road and over the hill.

Once a year the town came together to celebrate the rabbit. They did this by cooking it in all sorts of imaginative ways, and the most imaginative recipe won a prize and then this dish was shared by all - so were the rest of the cooked rabbits.

My neighbour, Dennis, came up with the ingenious thought of submitting San Choy Bau, which he named San Choy Bunny. He simply made the traditional recipe but, instead of using pork, he used minced bunny rabbit - very clever. I don't remember if he won or not - but he should have been acknowledged for a bloody good idea. The following is not his recipe, nevertheless I dips m'lid to him.

SAN CHOY BAU or SAN CHOY BUNNY

Ingredients

- 1 iceberg lettuce
- 2 tablespoons peanut oil (or olive oil)
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- · 2 teaspoons grated fresh ginger
- · 2 chillies, seeded and diced
- 1 kg pork mince (or bunny rabbit)
- 2 tablespoons Chinese rice wine (you can substitute dry sherry if that's easier)
- Soy sauce
- 4 spring onions, chopped
- Fresh coriander leaves (or whatever fresh herb you've got or, if you're using a dried herb, remember they have a strong favour so taste as to go along)
- · Sweet chilli sauce.

Method

The traditional San Choy Bau is an Asian dish where you spoon stir-fried meat of your choice (usually pork) into lettuce leaves, with various sauces. You can add water chestnuts, bean sprouts, bamboo shoots or anything else that takes your fancy.

In ice-cold water peel whole leaves away from lettuce and leave them, chilled, until needed. Heat a wok until hot, add peanut oil, garlic, ginger and chillies and cook until fragrant. Add the pork or rabbit mince and cook, stirring often. Add the Chinese rice wine, or sherry, and soy sauce to taste, along with spring onions and some chopped coriander leaves. Toss until combined. Spoon the mince into the lettuce 'cups' top with a little sweet chilli sauce and a sprig of fresh coriander and that's it.



Landcare

Mid-summer...a quiet time for our Landcare group but there is plenty to do and to contemplate for landowners. A wet 2022 has encouraged weed growth in many unwanted areas and shown us where water flows and sits.



One such place where weeds have flourished is the gravel paths up near the house and down in the veggie patch. We decided to renovate the paths. The first step was to rip up all of the weed mat from underneath the gravel. We don't use herbicides but the weed mat didn't help and will eventually disintegrate. The next step was to get out the weeds and respread the gravel. On top of the gravel around the veggie garden I have applied a thick layer of freely available mulch, it looks good and suppresses the weeds, completely, I hope! The other paths also look good; the task now is to keep them weed free.

Flower gardens generally thrive up here over summer. It is a time to enjoy the garden, keep the plants alive and looking good. A bit of water and plenty of mulch will do the trick and for most established native plants the mulch will be sufficient. It is also time to plan for autumn, as it is a good time to plant trees and shrubs. Three wet years in a row has certainly let us identify the wet areas on our properties and the opportunity to plant suitable species. There are many that will look good and assist biodiversity by attracting insects and birds. These include: tea tree, malalueca, bottle brush, wattles such as prickly moses, blackwood and wirilda and eucalypts such as swamp gum, red gum and manna gums. Tall sedge, thatch saw-hedge, hollow and joint leaf rush as well as the common spiny –headed mat-rush will all thrive in damp areas and provide cover for birds and frogs and food for butterflies and birds.

February is an important month in the veggie patch. It is a time when I am thankful of leaving some onions, carrots and coriander to go to seed and attract countless butterflies, native bees and other pollinators. I am also glad that I invested in some straw to suppress weeds and maintain moisture in the patch. It is now time to sow seeds for broccoli, sprouting broccoli, kale, cabbage, kohl rabi, cauliflower, brussell spouts and brukali. In cold areas it is important that these plants are established before winter sets in. We can also continue to plant parsnips, carrots, lettuce and beetroot. In March we can give spinach, pak choi and snow peas a go. Another crop to benefit was the broad beans as they picked right through until Christmas. April is the best time to plant them with the first of the beans to be ready to pick in spring. If you are fan, do as my parents do, freeze a years' supply!

Our Anniversary Garden in Lancefield Park has been blooming throughout spring and summer. The wattles, tea tree and bottle brush have been stunning. A bit of weeding and a bit more mulch will keep our native patch looking good throughout the year and continue to attract a variety of feathered friends.

The flood damage at some of our sites will necessitate a cleanup and some autumn planting. We also have a project in Romsey and another in Lancefield to complete in autumn. If you are keen to help we would love to hear from you.

Deep Creek Landcare Group has nesting boxes for bats, birds and phascogales for sale from \$25. We also have Myna bird traps to lend out. Annual Landcare membership is \$20 per family. - Fire at the Work Shed: With all the floods and other damaging events around Australia all insurance companies are more than busy. Throw in Christmas and New Year and you have a much-slowed process. We are awaiting the structural engineer's report on the damage to the shed and we will work with MRSC to sort that one out.
- 2022 Presentation Afternoon: Presentation afternoon was held on Sat Dec 17th. With shared rooms the golf club had to be over and done with by 5.00pm to allow the bowls club to hold their end of year celebrations. The day saw the introduction of a new shield, The Mitchell Family Shield (Best Nett A Grade) and the re-purposing of the Peter Scanlon Shield (Best Nett B Grade) and the John

- Patching the fairways: It is amazing how things crop up. One of the people who assisted us with evaluating the damage to various machinery mentioned, in passing that a section of his company was replacing flood damaged fairways at a large club. Once the large rolls of santa ana turf were rolled out the off cuts were just piled up. A quick phone call and it was agreed that RGC could use some of these off cuts. Many thanks to Anthony Lakey and Clive Mensforth who drove down for the pick-up. The offcuts were initially laid out where they would be irrigated and then low areas of our fairways were selected, filled with loose soil and covered with the turf. Most of these "patches" have survived quite well.
- Coring the Greens: Well, the third attempt in late Nov but no go, way too wet. We now plan to core in early March, fingers crossed.
- 2023 Relay For Life Charity Golf Day; Our 15th RFL Charity Golf Day will be held on Sunday Feb 19th. The four-player Ambrose event is always great fun and funds raised go to "Puddles Team" in the 2023 Lancefield/Macedon Ranges Relay For Life. So far the day has raised well over \$26,000. Fight cancer by supporting the Lancefield Relay For Life.

36,974 Victorians were diagnosed with cancer in 2021. That's an average of 1 new cancer diagnosis every 14 minutes. In 2021 in Victoria 32 people died from cancer every day.

But it is not all doom and gloom as the 5-year survival rate for Victorians diagnosed with cancer has increased 22% (to nearly 70%) over the past twenty years.

These are not just tasks for researchers and clinicians, they are goals that need to be supported by the wider community by fund raising and by giving comfort and care to those who have cancer.

Lancefield Relay For Life is a Macedon Ranges based event run to support those who have cancer and to raise funds for the Cancer Council of Victoria ("CCV").

The money raised is used by the CCV to fund research, the provision of a range of services to those affected by cancer and to support the advocacy work of the CCV. It was CCV which gave us the enormously successful Quit and Slip Slop Slap campaigns. CCV also runs a Cancer Support Hotline(phone 131120) staffed by trained cancer nurses. The CCV website(cancervic.org.au) contains an amazing amount of information about cancer and the work the CCV undertakes.

Nationally, Cancer Councils invested almost \$250 million in Australian cancer research over the past five years.

In March 2002 a marvellous group of local people, most of them women who had lost friends or family to cancer, formed a committee and rallied the local community to run and support the first Lancefield Relay For Life. In 2023 we will have our 20th Relay (COVID robbed us of one event). The Lancefield Relay For Life has raised about \$1,500,000 to date.

You can help CCV and those who have cancer by becoming a part of the 2023 Lancefield Relay For Life on Saturday 4 March from 11.00am to 9.00pm. For more information and to become a participant see *relayforlife.org.au*.


HOMECOMING by Kate Morton


DEAD TIDE by Fiona McIntosh

Pop Up Garlic Farmers Incubator is Back

To give Australians hands-on experiences in a new generation of farmers, Farmer Incubator has recommenced the Pop Up Garlic Farmers (PUGF) program in Melbourne, and new in Canberra.

Kicking off in February, people in Melbourne and Canberra can learn how to plant and nurture a market garden-scale garlic crop from seed to harvest and market.

The program is run at farms/ market gardens such as Days Walk Farm in Keilor, Wildwood Organics in the Macedon Ranges, and ECOSS Yarra Valley. Renown farmers and scientists, many learning originally through Farmer Incubator, will give hands-on support.



their own food enterprises. Willow was in the program in 2021, and is now running a small-scale organic farm for North Melbourne Mauritian restaurant, Manzé, in a land-share with Tanaka Farm in Clarkefield. This began when Willow asked Manze to purchase garlic grown in our program. They said about their experience:

"PUGF was a game-changer. I was curious about growing food large scale. Taking the pop-up garlic farmers course taught me, and connected me to others to grow food around the city. I met local advocates, experienced gardeners, and chefs looking for fresher local produce. Such a joy!" - Willow, they/them, kitchen gardener for Manzé

Eight weekend workshops run from February to November 2023 eg. on Soil Preparation, Pest and Disease Management and Product Marketing. You are given seed for 500 plants, and tour established small farms to understand the environment, build skills and collaboration.

Graduates may work in farm internships, jobs or start

Participants gain knowledge, networks and confidence to grow an organic garlic crop.

Dom Mendoca, PUGF 2021 participant: "PUGF was amazing. The workshop on soil health in particular was a life-changing "awakening". Networking and knowledgeable mentors was exactly what I needed."





From the Desk of Pastor Tim

I find it interesting how the meaning of words can change over time. One word that has changed is 'hope'. We say "I hope the weather is good tomorrow", but we may have no confidence that this will actually occur. Our hopes are now wishes.



In a dictionary the word 'hope' often has an archaic (old) meaning such as 'trust, reliance'. That is, rather than a 'wish' for something, it is a confident expectation of it happening.



Working on Friendships



Our Romsey Mens Shed is operational and will welcome new members!

Our Romsey Mens Shed is now almost 3 years old and at the AGM in October we reflected on developments since the First AGM in the Scout Hall in 2019. The foundation slab was laid in 2020 and with financial support from the federal and state governments via our local parliamentarians, Rob Mitchell and Mary-Anne Thomas and the Lancefield/Romsey Community Bank, we completed the building. Generous tools and equipment donations then flowed from the community.

LIFE MEMBERSHIPS. At the 2022 AGM we awarded the first Life Memberships to three members who had worked tirelessly to set up the Shed - Paul Green, Patrick Holt and Steve Goodman - were presented with a recognition certificate by Councillor Bill West, who assisted with the committee election process.

The newly elected committee are continuing with the core role of the Romsey Mens Shed; working on friendships for men and providing a comfortable environment to discuss their issues. All members enjoy the social environment; a coffee and chat and many are also "hands-on" as ex-trades/engineering with some learning new skills on woodwork, metalwork/welding, glass cutting or automotive (we even have a lift).

THET MODEL PROJECT. As reported previously, we have a major new project - restoration of a 1925 T model Ford. A multi-skill project we hope over time will receive some donations and support from the Romsey community, perhaps with extra skills or parts hidden away in sheds. The sausage sizzle at the IGA on Saturday 19 was a fundraiser with the T model skeleton displayed on a trailer. We have now joined a national T model network.
