



## Romsey Mechanics' Institute

- **Old Time Dancing:** Our recent ventures into "Old Time Dancing" have proven quite popular with a number of people looking for more of these events. We will speak with the organisers to see just what is possible in the future.
- Main Hall Refurbishment: Many people will remember that in 2022 we were able to arrange visits to the RMI by specialists to view the current condition of the main hall and to prepare quotes for preparation and re-painting, in heritage colours and for replacement window and stage curtains. All that was needed was inspection of the timber windows and quotes to repair and/or replace the damaged ones. A quote for these works should soon be with the CoM. Once we have this final quote, we can begin the process of sourcing funds to carry out the works.
- **Solar Power:** Our 7.7Kw battery and additional solar panels to bring the system up to 3.735 Kw were installed a little over a month ago. In coming months we will begin to see the positive effects of these additions to the hall's renewable power system.
- **Film Nights:** Our final two subsidised film night will go ahead in late August and early September. The Romsey Scouts and Hesket P. S. have taken advantage of the Bendigo Bank grant of \$500 per event which will see the CoM provide the use of the hall and AV equipment free of charge and also pay the license fees for the film and the music in the sound-track. We wish both groups very successful nights where they can enjoy getting together and also raise much needed funds.

## September in the garden

Spring is here! The yellow of the wattle and the daffodils are the big heralders of warmer weather for me. Joined by the forsythia, the mahonia and soon the sophora – all yellow too. On the breeze is the waft of the daphne – that will be one of the first plants to be planted in my new garden! Inside, a precious specimen of a succulent called split rock (Pleiospilos nelii) flowered for the first time! It produced a single orange flower which (my mother said) looked like a calendula! The flower lasted for a few days opening only briefly each afternoon for a few hours.

The first garden project took place last weekend when Trevor and I built two small raised garden beds outside the back door (on the south side of the house). These are for the Solomon's seal and lily-of-the-valley (Polygonatum odoratum and Convalaria majalis) that I have transplanted from the old house. They did well on the south side of the old house so I have replicated those conditions here. It was a good time to transplant these two, as they were just beginning to produce new shoots for the coming season.

The other thing I have done is get on top of all the small weeds in the areas of mud around the house and in the driveway before they turn into big weeds! Ignore the weeds at your peril! The front garden at the old house was mulched a few weeks ago to smother the germinating weeds.

Nothing worse than inspecting a house with a weedy garden! I also limed the garlic and the peony a fortnight ago (with dolomite lime) so I can now feed them. You are supposed to wait a week or so between liming and fertilising. Apparently, they both really like their soil to be well-limed!

## **ROMSEY LANCEFIELD AVENUE of HONOUR**

The Romsey Lancefield Rotary Club Inc. and the Returned & Services League of Australia (RSL Romsey Lancefield – subbranch) continue to develop the Avenue of Honour between the townships of Romsey and Lancefield. The establishment of the Avenue of Honour commenced in 2008. Between 2011 and 2017 small plagues were unveiled by the local primary schools, local businesses and family members wishing to commemorate Australian servicemen and women who fought in battles or peace keeping operations in theatres of war. The larger plagues or shadow boards were designed and manufactured locally and supported through the Federal Government's Department of Veteran Affairs Commemorative -Armistice Centenary Grants scheme. As part of this grant, seven Lone Pine Trees were provided to the local primary schools to plant in their school grounds.

The three large shadow boards commemorate the 100 years of the Armistice. They include a range of large metal cut-sculptures depicting the 4th Light Horse Brigade at Beersheba, the ANZAC Day landing and the Western Front campaigns. The unveiling by the Member for McEwen, the Right Honourable Rob Mitchell (MP) in 2021 was delayed due to COVID-19 restrictions.

The Romsey Lancefield Rotary Club Inc. and the RSLsub-branch wish to thank those property owners who continue to diligently mow along this Avenue. Rotarians and local volunteers have spent many working bees over



the years mowing, whipper snipping, eradicating weeds and brambles as well as removing rubbish to further extend the visual appeal of this Avenue.

More large shadow boards have been planned to commemorate the Vietnam War and the Huey helicopter, the role and commitment of Indigenous Australians in world wars, Australian Nurses, and the Malaya Campaign (particularly the role of N0.1 squadron - Lincoln bombers).

A recent audit of the smaller plaques has shown some are warping due to the weather, other are damaged or have been stolen. This is very disappointing to those who sponsored these plaques to commemorate family members. After assessing the disrepair, the Romsey Lancefield Rotary Club Inc. is reviewing the smaller plaque's design and manufacture with a view to full restoration.

The Romsey Lancefield Rotary Club Inc. meets every fortnight on Thursdays (7 pm – 9 pm) at Soltan Pepper Restaurant. Community members interested in becoming Rotarians are very welcome to join us.

## **GALLIPOLI**

The 25<sup>th</sup> April 1915 was the start of one of Australia's most costly Military engagements. The efforts of the Australian Imperial Force helped forge Australia's name in Military history. The Campaign entailed very heavy fighting and yet it resulted in no gains for either side and after eight months the Force carried out a strategic withdrawal.

The courage shown throughout the Campaign was costly for Australia – 8500 lives were lost with 19000 personnel wounded. The date of the landing is commemorated each year, as ANZAC Day, in honour of those who served on the Gallipoli Peninsular.

## **Cooking with Peter Russell-Clarke**

## September is my birthday month. And so, my family and friends will have a knees-up with all the trimmings.

Some time ago I was subjected to some awful mail, and the consternation of a vocal few, (and they were vocal), because I revealed, on TV and in an article, my favourite recipe. What I maintained (and still do) is a simple recipe for scrambled eggs.

Many years ago, again on my birthday, I was given a tip by the then Drama Director of the ABC.

"Use the juice of quarter of an orange instead of milk," he informed me. "The French use water 'cos they reckon the steam given off by the water heating makes the egg

Fanta? concoction light. The English add milk because, during the War eggs were scarce and the milk made them go further.

I nodded that I agreed with him and I've been using orange juice ever since. And I used the tip on my TV programme.

The next day I was confronted by an elderly lady who snapped at me "I didn't think much of your orange idea" she frowned. "It was too flamin' sweet!"

"Well, you must be using sweet Navel oranges," I said. "Eh?" She said.

"What oranges are you using, madam?" I asked.

And anyway, the orange colour is OK for the yolk."

"Oranges? I wasn't using oranges, luv, I was using Fanta!"

Now, Fanta is NOT for scrambled eggs. You must use fresh orange juice or a fresh pre-squeezed one, but make sure it's proper orange juice!

## **SCRAMBLED EGGS WITH ORANGE JUICE**

- 1. Use 3 eggs per person and, in a small bowl you gently beat those. Don't beat them too hard. Pop in some pepper, leave the salt till last, by the way, till they're finished cooking, and don't put any milk in because milk turns eggs leathery. You know if you boil milk it takes on a little funny flavour and goes leathery. You can put some water in if you wish, but I prefer the orange juice we were talking about before.
- 2. Now, in a pan melt a generous dollop of butter, don't let it get too hot, and then pour the eggs into that butter. Now slowly move them around the pan with a fork until they thicken and, just before they're fully cooked, stir in an
- 3. Egg cup full of sour cream and say half a handful of chopped parsley. Now put the salt on and put them out onto a plate. But put them out while they're still a bit sloppy because, remember, while you put them out and get them to the table, they're still cooking.



Top with chopped anchovies, chives, crumbled fried bacon, toasted muesli, chopped capsicum or minced chicken meat. Or fry onions separately and stir in at the last minute. Or mix with chunks of raw apple.

- You've mucked it up?
- They're tough and leathery?
- You've cooked them too quickly over too high a heat..
- You didn't keep stirring them when they were cooking.
- You didn't use a thick pan.

Perhaps scrambled eggs originated because in the old days they didn't have crush-proof cartons. Though there is a school of thought who cling to the notion that they were invented in the East - they were the eggs laid from fighting cocks after a furious battle. But then, cocks don't lay eggs do they? So it looks like the first idea is right after all.

**Machinery:** Over winter we have had to do a great deal of work on some of our machines. The engine of the surrounds mower was almost completely rebuilt and we have had to repair damage to the cutting deck of the rough mower. Normally this time of year is very quiet with mowing every 2nd week but we have had to continue weekly mowing of the fairways and large areas of the rough. The spring burst of growth will soon be here and we need our machines at their best.

2023 Dalhousie District Bowl: This year's Bowl was played at Broadford, the course was in excellent condition but the greens were more than challenging. In a Bowl teams of four play in pairs and the top three scores for each team are counted. Par for the course should be 108 Stableford points. No team achieved that score and no-one in the field

## A Bahh-Ewe-Tiful Transformation

## One lucky sheep is now looking, in more ways than one, to an entire new world thanks to human kindness and shear luck.



Spotted on the weekend by recreational walkers was a woolly mammoth of a sheep. One who looked more like the lichen covered boulders in the area she had sought refuge than her ovine kind. But it was her incessant circling that alerted all was not well.





Calling nearby animal sanctuary, Edgar's Mission, help was soon at hand, er, hoof!

"When I saw the video of the dear sheep circling continuously and knowing nightfall was not too far away, I knew we had to act fast," said sanctuary Founder and Director, Pam Ahern.

Calling on local council for assistance, the property owner was soon located and surrender of the animal was swift.

"We learned that Methuselah, as we have named her due to her age, had wandered on to the property from who knows where some time ago, with her original owner unable to be traced."

Domesticated sheep of today do not naturally shed their wool like their ancestorial cousins. Given the great length and depth of Methuselah's fleece it is estimated she has not been shorn for around 4-5 years. In places it was even growing grass!

"It didn't take too long to catch Methuselah, for she was blinded by wool and burdened by all of that fleece. This gave us a great jump start."

In video released by the sanctuary, team member Leonie Mertens can be seen racing in and swiftly catching Methuselah.

Once back at the sanctuary the "blind" sheep was reunited with the world as shears removed the offending fleece from her eyes, and today another 24.5 kilos of burdensome wool was removed to reveal Methuselah's small frame that had been hidden for years.

"It was like someone had turned the lights on for the poor lass," said Pam, adding "She just looked up at us as if to say thank you, and her demeanour changed from fearfully cowering, to happily munching on fresh hay."

Methuselah was immediately given two set of warm coats to help her body adjust.

"As sheep are not only prey animals, but herd animals, Methuselah's life would have been pretty terrifying before human kindness refused to look the other way. We are so thankful to the kind-hearted walkers who made the call and even came back to assist us getting the heavy lass into our vehicle," added Pam.

This is on the same weekend as the Romsey wide garage sale on Saturday 9 September, when we will also have a sale table at the Shed, in Barry Street. A mix of surplus tools and some white goods and shed products will be available.

**Tuesday 9-4 and Thursday 10-2 are our normal open days:** Many Shed members come on Tuesday for work and talk – often mainly talk, which we encourage, as we value social engagement. However, the Thursday \$5 barbeque/lunch at 12 is the most popular day for members and the occasional guest.

Our "hands-on" members have woodwork, wood turning, metal/welding and automotive workshop activities. Some training for new starters to a practical level, on some tools and machines, even glass cutting, is available by arrangement. Some small jobs for the community also undertaken and we are currently making some scoreboards for St Marys in Lancefield.

The weekly event, which begins at 8 am every Saturday morning near the entrance to the Lancefield Recreation Ground, is a community event run by volunteers and is totally free.



## Recent Local Crime Events



A 58-year-old male has been arrested after a theft at Main St, Romsey. In an opportunistic crime, the offender pocketed a wallet which had been left behind at a store by the previous customer. He took an amount of cash and discarded the wallet in the street. He is likely to be charged on summons. The wallet was later found by a member of the public in Stawell Street and returned to the owner. Romsey Police are looking to identify the finder to further assist in the matter. A male and female in their 50's were arrested and a number of cannabis plants seized from a Romsey address after an accidental fire led to the discovery of a hydroponic set-up. The offenders have been bailed to appear at the Kyneton Magistrates Court, charged with cultivating cannabis.

#### **Firearms**

Having been a year since firearms storage requirements were amended and after a recent burglary where a firearm was stolen from a rack on a wall, it is timely to remind firearms licence holders of their responsibility and legal requirement to store firearms safely and appropriately. Schedule 4 of the Firearms Act 1996 notes the storage requirements including that storage must be in a purposebuilt receptacle made of steel of a thickness of at least 1.6mm. It must be bolted to the structure



Failure to comply can result in significant fines and/or up to a year imprisonment.

### **Lost Property**

We regularly receive items of lost property, found in various locations by members of the public. Due to a number of factors, we are often unable to identify the rightful owner so these items are either returned to the finder, donated to charity or otherwise disposed of. If you have lost an item, ensure you check in with us at the Romsey Police Station as we may well have your item and be looking for you. We will otherwise note your lost item in the event it is handed in later.

One such item we are currently holding is a wearable fitness device found at the Romsey Ecotherapy park.

If you have lost such a device, please contact with us with sufficient information to prove ownership and it will be returned to you.

## Council's Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme grant approved

The ACVVS is a free service available for those in residential aged care or Home Care Package recipients. Volunteers are matched to a recipient with similar interests and can be:

- · one-on-one or group visits to residential aged care homes
- one-on-one visits to people receiving a Home Care Package.

ACVVS is designed to connect with those who are or may feel socially isolated; do not have regular positive and engaged contact with friends or relatives; have frailty, mobility or communication impairment that prevents them from participating in social or leisure opportunities; or do not participate in social support group services funded by a Commonwealth-subsidised aged care program.

The ACVVS team works with our volunteers to support, supervise and coordinate the volunteering program and promote Council's Positive Ageing Plan.

High-quality social connections are essential to our mental and physical health and our wellbeing.

## Preparing your property for the fire season

Spring is here! It's time to shake off the cobwebs of winter and venture outdoors to enjoy some sunshine. Spring is also a great time to start preparing your property for the summer when fires are likely to happen.

You can reduce the risk to your home and property by cleaning up around your dwelling or building and clearing potential fire hazards before the fire danger period kicks in.

These jobs include:

- removing any overhanging tree branches and shrubs over one metre high next to or below windows
- keeping grass short and clearing other combustible debris near your home
- · clearing roof gutters of any leaf litter
- maintaining any defendable space around your home
- · ensuring any rainwater tanks are accessible and full
- ensuring you have a bushfire survival plan in place and practise it regularly – this should also include pets
- attending local CFA community meetings around fire preparedness – follow CFA's North West Region Community Safety Facebook page for dates and times.

# Our continuing series of notable buildings in Romsey

## **Neal's General Store 111-113 Main Street Romsey**

This two-story red brick and stucco shop and residence was built for Frederick Octavious Neal in 1884, by Alfred Pugh. (Alfred also built the stately six-bedroom home at 79 Main Street and the Romsey Mechanics Institute.) This new grand building was built next to Neal's butcher shop that he opened in 1877 when he purchased and moved the National Bank's old wooden building to the site. Hence why the wording on this building states 'Established A.D. 1877. The General Store Building was obviously impressive and was mentioned in the Romsey Examiner on the 24th of January 1884, 'One of the best finished and most complete shops in the district is Mr. F.O. Neal's new brick building in Main Street, Romsey. The work is a credit to the contractor Mr. Alfred Pugh.'

## A little history about the man, Frederick Octavious Neal and his family.

Frederick Neal was born in London 1834, arrived in Melbourne in 1854, bringing with him his wife, Mary Smith and their young son. During the years of 1866-68, Frederick was the publican of Duckholes Hotel. Mary and Frederick had 8 children before Mary died aged 49 in 1883. Frederick remarried a year later in 1884 to Sarah Bennett. Frederick retired from his general store and leased it to his sons, Frederick junior,

Joseph and William in 1887. The Neal sons finally retired from this store in 1897. The Neal's General Store is significant as a major element in the Romsey commercial streetscape. It symbolises the importance these towns once held in this rich farming district. Its association with the Neal family is also a long one, this family having links with both commercial enterprises and the timber industry.

On the award nomination, Council's CEO Bernie O'Sullivan said: "Council is thrilled to have the Romsey storm waste facility named as a finalist for another award, and we would again like to thank Emergency Recovery Victoria for the support in its implementation.

"This project was born out of the need to respond quickly to the wide-spread destruction caused by the June 2021 storms. Council recognises that the Macedon Ranges community strongly values environmental stewardship, recycling and 'green' solutions, so these were the principles we kept in mind when looking at solutions for the clean-up operation.

"Our focus was to reduce green waste to zero by creating repurposed products for impacted Councils and communities.

"This flagship facility has created a new standard for operational recovery, and is a model that can be applied by Councils across Victoria for any future disasters."

Winners are set to be announced at an awards night in October.

## Community Bus Co-op calls time

## It is with much sadness that we announce the closure of the Lancefield Romsey Commuter Bus Co-operative Ltd.

The service was established in 1981 and in nearly 40 years has transported hundreds of people from Lancefield, Romsey and surrounding towns to the CBD on a daily basis.

We would like to thank everyone involved in the bus, especially those who contributed tirelessly on the Committee and those who selflessly drove for us. It has been a wonderful service to the Lancefield and Romsey communities offering direct, affordable transport to the CBD where sadly the public transport system does not.

We do now have the pleasure of donating our vehicle to the Lancefield & Romsey Neighbourhood Houses who will continue the co-operative spirit and put the vehicle to work for the community.

Second life - car donated to Neighbourhood Houses

We are so excited that the Lancefield and Romsey Neighbourhood Houses Community Transport project, Community Driven, has had a third car donated to its fleet – we are equally sad that we have the car due to the end of another great community project.

The donated car is a Kia Carnival which will seat five passengers comfortably. The main use for the car will be the collection and distribution of food for our Food Share programs, towing the fantastic refrigerated trailer that the Rotary Club have made for this purpose.

The car will also be used as a backup for medical transport and supporting our ShareRide social outings, allowing another five people to join these trips – see below for upcoming trips.

Community Driven is a joint Lancefield and Romsey Neighbourhood Houses project – it has two project areas:

- 1. transport to medical appointments by volunteer drivers.
- 2. ShareRide which provides;
  - a. a door-to-door service to locations for shopping or fitness, such as water aerobics or swimming.
  - b. a shuttle between and around Romsey and Lancefield one day a week for people who don't drive but need to go to the bank, chemist or shops etc.
  - c. monthly social event outings to a variety of places and activities
  - d. on the fourth Tuesday of the month, transport to the Feed it Forward lunch.

The first car the project had was a Commodore donated by a very generous individual, they have since upgraded this to a red Lancer. The black LDV people mover has been made possible through the Bendigo Bank providing a three-year grant to lease the car and the new Kia Carnival donated by the Commuter Co-Op.

If you know people who are isolated due to not being able to drive, please tell them about Community Driven. You
