

















Gaming Machines

Everyone will be aware that the Senior Football/ Netball Club has applied for a license for 50 gaming machines within the Romsey Hotel. There was a community consultation process some months ago.

Romsey House is currently being renovated and expect to open before the end of the year so the town will have that facility for drinks and meals but without gaming machines.

Currently the Riddells Creek and Lancefield hotels do good business, serving well over 1,000 meals a week, without gaming machines.

There are three gaming venues in Macedon Ranges Shire, two in Kyneton (25 and 28 machines) and one Gisborne (50 machines) with a total of 103 machines. This application, if successful, would see an increase in machines of almost 50%.

The Victorian Gambling and Casino Control Commission (VGCCC) data shows that, during 2022/23, gaming machine players lost over \$9,000,000 across these 103 machines - and that figure is growing.

These losses average out to \$88,000 per machine per annum in the Macedon Ranges Shire. That is before any increase in the number of machines.

This is a major issue for our town and we all need to put our opinions forward.

Whether you are for or against these gaming machines please take the time to have your say.

It has been a tough year for Australians and the world. The hottest 12 months in recorded history, climate change induced floods, droughts and bushfires. Wars in Ukraine and the Middle East have wreaked havoc.

Australia is not immune eg, the despair of Indigenous people after the "Voice" referendum result and our cost-of-living crisis. Hopefully, higher interest rates curb inflation and governments reduce the impact of the housing crisis on the vulnerable and find solutions to a problem of many years.

Good news, I hope, on energy prices. After higher gas and electricity prices in 2022, the wholesale price of electricity in September Quarter 2023 was half the previous year. Win! A win for renewable power, eg. rooftop solar. Less reliance on fossil fuels - and a lower price. We hope lower wholesale price feeds through to consumers in 2024 retail prices!

As we "Rewire Australia" greenhouse emissions will decline and the cost of energy should decline. Maybe we can get to Net Zero by 2050.

Safety on Public Land Act 2004

NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC SAFETY ZONE DECLARATION

I, Mark Mellington, Acting Deputy Chief Fire Officer, Grampians Region, as delegate of the Secretary to the Department of Energy, Environment and Climate Action, give notice pursuant to section 7(1A) of the Safety on Public Land Act 2004, that I have made public safety zone declarations published in the Victoria Government Gazette (Special Gazette S506-23) dated 25/09/2023.

The declaration made on 25/09/2023 takes effect from 02/10/2023 to 02/01/2024 inclusive specifies areas of State Forest which have been declared public safety zones for the purpose of the maintenance of public safety and the safe management of fuel reduction activities.

The declaration specifies the period for which the areas have been declared public safety zones; the times or periods during which access is restricted or prohibited; restrictions or conditions (if any) applying to the public safety zones; and persons or classes of persons exempt from their operation.

Our Series of Notable Buildings-from the Historical Society.

The (original) Romsey Hotel

119 Main Street was the first hotel in the Romsey Township – You may know it as Romsey House (Evans Wine Bar etc).

William Campbell purchased the site for 4 pounds. His son-in-law & daughter Lachlan and Mary Robertson built the hotel and were licensees from 1860 to 1887.

'The Proprietor begs to intimate to his numerous friends that he has always on hand superior assortments of wines and spirits and fermented drinks of the best quality, and being the oldest established hotel in the township needs no guarantee of the first-class accommodation obtainable. Ample and commodious stabling, loose boxes etc.' (The Lancefield Examiner, 11/9/1873)

Lachlan Campbell in 1875 purchased the Royal Mail Hotel (cnr Ochiltrees and Main Roads) from Sam Hunt along with 160 acres, renaming it 'Glenbride'. By 1888 the Campbell brothers owned almost 2000 acres.

A well-known judge was prone to leave his bench for the comfort of the 'Romsey' even though the business of the court was held up during his absence. In its heyday the hotel enjoyed a high reputation for the excellent catering and social events. William Campbell sold the Romsey Hotel to his two sons in 1875 for 903 pounds.

Lachlan Robertson purchased the right to sell liquor (Romsey Examiner 27/10/1881). His hotel was well located for the Romsey stock market at the Murphy and Pohlman Street corner, and his refreshment booth was seen at Lancefield races.

From 1887 to 1893, Romsey had 6 hotels to compete with! Returning to run the hotel, Lachlan Robertson became insolvent in 1895 and his wife, Mary and then Sarah Campbell briefly held the license. Kenneth Campbell transferred his holding to Sarah Campbell in 1906. One armed Norm Taylor bought the hotel in 1925. By 9/11/1928, A.C. McLean of Queen Street Melbourne was mortgagee in possession. The license was surrendered on 30 September 1944.

Romsey's south facing wall once had concrete letters - chiseled off during WWII in case the enemy recognized where they were!

The building served as tearoom, restaurant, and cafe, from 1970's to the present day. There is so much more to this building and its occupants. **www.romseylancefieldhistorical.org.au**

December in the garden

Now that my garden is reduced to a sea of pots: I have to look elsewhere for inspiration to write this monthly column until I have a garden once again! So, I went for a stroll along Main Rd to the shops. There was plenty to see being spring, including the section of footpath that the kids scribbled on nearly 20 years ago. Amazingly I still remember most of the names!

I spotted some beautiful roses along the way including one pink one being grown against a telephone pole – that's a great idea! I can't even hazard a guess as to its identity but I'm guessing its an old cultivar of some sort. The bush was smothered in blooms. I also saw a lovely hybrid tea rose which I think might have

been 'Apricot Nectar' but I'm not positive. But the highlight was a magnificent row of grey-leaved flowering tea-tree in a fabulous lolly pink. The grey foliage against the pink was stunning. It might have been Leptospermum 'Seclusions'. A bit further on another tea-tree possibly 'Alicia Rose' was a darker pink and also looked amazing. The bees were going wild for the flowers.

Then I came across something really unusual – a clump of black bamboo in flower! It was probably Phyllostachys nigra. Bamboo as a rule only flowers rarely (like every few decades) and after flowering the clump usually dies and new plants grow from all the seed that is produced. Supposedly the same species of bamboo flowers all over the world at the same time and then it all (mostly) dies

at once. The northern hemisphere experienced a mass flowering of black bamboo in 2022 and into 2023. The interesting thing about the clump I saw, is that although it was flowering, the clump next to it was not! Is your black bamboo flowering? What a great thing to see on a morning stroll!

Cooking with Peter Russell-Clarke

G'day,

I got such a good response from last month's article about Thai food that I had the idea to serve you for this month a Malaysian dish - Nasi Kunyit.

Last month's Thai food was for my grandchildren who are half Thai, this month's is for my major art client, a Malaysian on the island of Penang. He buys numerous paintings 6 ft x 4 ft and sends them all round the world. He has a processed fish business called Golden Fresh and, apart from his product being top line, he is a top line bloke. He is starting up a factory in Poland.

NASI KUNYIT

Ingredients:

- 500g pulot (glutinous rice)
- 2 cups water
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- 1 teaspoon ground turmeric (for colour as well as taste)
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- · 2 cups hot coconut milk
- 1 daun pandan*

Method:

 Wash rice and drain. Put into a saucepan with water, garlic, salt, turmeric, pepper and pandanus leaf for flavouring. Heat till boiling, reduce heat, cover tightly and steam for 10 minutes. Remove the lid,, add coconut milk (which you've made very hot) and now stir gently so that the rice is mixed with the coconut milk. Then cover and cook for another 10 minutes.

Serve garnished with anything you like.

(The rice is sweet, so don't be afraid of sweet and sour.)

• daun pandan: used as a flavour and colouring in Malaysian sweets. The long, flat, green leaves are crushed or boiled to yield the flavour and colour. The taste is very popular with Malaysians, I hope it will be with you too.

Noel Coward once wrote 'Wit ought to be a glorious treat, like caviar. Never spread it about like marmalade.' He obviously was not talking about this recipe. You can spread Nasi Kanyit around like marmalade. For instance, I serve it with Italian sausages. The sweet flavour of the rice is enhanced by savoury flavour of the sausage - and vice versa.

NOTE: If you can't find glutinous rice for this recipe (or 'sticky' or 'sweet' rice - they're the same thing) use a short-grain rice or risotto rice, which have a stickier texture when cooked. Medium grain rice tends to cook up moist and tender while short-grain rice tends to clump together when cooked and forms 'glutinous' rice. Although all rice is naturally gluten free, 'glutinous' refers to its glue-like or 'sticky' rice texture.

PS. This recipe doesn't go well with a traditional Christmas cake, but a Lions Christmas cake, wet with a little brandy and fashioned into miniature Christmas cake balls with a little melted white chocolate on top is good-oh. For those brave enough to put a spoonful of glutinous rice beside the Christmas cake - good luck to you.

Romsey Rainbow Coffee Club

If you live in the Macedon Ranges and are looking to meet people whilst visiting local attractions, the Sunbury and Cobaw Community Health social support bus trip program could be for you. The program offers small group outings to galleries, gardens, shopping centres and other regional and metropolitan destinations. Thriving Villages Funding Application Success

EMRBATA has been successful in its application to the State Government Flood Relief Grant Program. With the assistance of a professional consultancy (www.villagewell.org), "Town Activation Plans" will be developed for Romsey and Lancefield. These will identify and address deficiencies in both towns as they relate to visitor economy product, economic leakage and identification of opportunities. It will ultimately aim to build business resilience and thriving communities. The Romsey and Lancefield projects will dovetail into Tourism Macedon Ranges' (TMR's) Thriving Villages project (also funded through this State Government Grant Program) which addresses the broader regional situation. The project will commence in May and be completed by November. Stay tuned for further developments on this exciting opportunity for our eastern region!

EMRBATA Submission to MRSC Budget

EMRBATA has made a submission to the 2024-2025 MRSC Budget to support a Specialist Horticulture Position to be responsible for the specialised parks and gardens in the Shire. Of particular interest to the eastern corridor is the Romsey Ecotherapy Park which (along with the Shire's Botanical Gardens) needs specialised care in order to retain its

visitor and local appeal. The Romsey Five Mile Creek was acknowledged as an important local asset in the Draft Romsey Structure Plan. As such, EMRBATA will be lobbying for the implementation of Stage 2 of the Five Mile Creek Master Plan. The Lions' proposed skate park upgrade in Romsey is an important project for both locals and visitors to the region and is also worthy of Budget consideration. With skateboarding now an Olympic sport, the appeal and need (especially amongst younger people) is not in doubt. Congratulations to the Lions' Club for pursuing this important infrastructure project.



Romsey storm waste facility wins sustainability award

Council's flagship storm waste facility now has a trio of awards to its name, having been recognised at the 2023 Keep Australia Beautiful Victoria Tidy Towns & Cities Sustainability Awards.

Taking out the EPA Waste Prevention and Reduction category, it is the facility's third award following recognition in the Health & Safety Excellence (Small to Medium Enterprise) category at the 2022 Australian Workplace Health & Safety Awards (in partnership with Tree Mason and Action OHS Consulting) and the Special Projects Initiative category at the 2023 LGPro Awards for Excellence. Located near Romsey, the Council-managed facility was developed out of the need to respond quickly to the severe destruction caused by storms in June 2021, with a focus on eliminating green waste by creating repurposed products for impacted councils and communities. CEO Bernie O'Sullivan said Council was thrilled that the storm waste facility had been recognised for another award and that it again highlighted the benefits of regional scale, upcycling products back to affected landowners and a strong partnership between local and state government.

"This invaluable project was made possible through a strong collaboration between Council and a number of hardworking Council staff, Emergency Recovery Victoria and the community," he said.

"We were not only able to act swiftly to solve a major problem in a very practical and cost-effective way, but the most pleasing thing is to have been able to give back to affected communities."

Since its implementation, the facility has processed over 65,000 tonnes of tree and storm debris, while returning recycled or repurposed products back to impacted communities with a total market value of over \$35 million, including:

- timber for community projects
- · fencing supplies and retaining wall sleepers
- stakes for Council tree planting programs
- free firewood for nearly 2,000 Macedon Ranges residents
- 90 truckloads of root balls to enhance fish breeding habitat within rivers and water systems
- hundreds of cubic metres of sawdust for local pig farmers
- over 180,000 cubic meters of mulch.

"The facility sets a new standard for post-disaster clean up and is a model that could be easily replicated anywhere, so hopefully our learnings will also help give other councils an idea for a practical solution for emergency recovery, should they ever need it," Mr O'Sullivan said.

"Edgar's Mission has rescued over 800 new animals in need over the past 12 months, and has found forever homes for a similar number, whilst assisting with rehoming many more," Pam said. "We can all make an enormous difference in the life of pigs, turkeys, lambs and others by what – and not who – we choose to eat and buy this festive season," Pam said.

Fire Danger Period and heat preparations this summer

Residents are being urged to prepare for an increased likelihood of warmer and drier conditions over summer, with the Country Fire Authority (CFA) declaring the Fire Danger Period for the Macedon Ranges to begin at 1am on 27 November 2023, to end on 1 May 2024 (unless otherwise advised). During the Fire Danger Period, no fire may be lit in the open air without a permit.

Council is focused on working with the community to collectively reduce our shire's fire risk, including undertaking an annual roadside slashing program across Council-managed roads to reduce the likelihood of fires starting from hot vehicle exhausts, mechanical failures and collisions.

Council's Municipal Fire Prevention Officers are also conducting property inspections across the shire to check for fire hazards and issue Fire Prevention Notices where appropriate.

Residents are reminded of the importance of being prepared for fires, and to ensure their properties are maintained to ensure there are minimum flammable fuels including stockpiles of green waste and foliage in gutters. Free green waste disposal is available for ratepayers and tenants at Council's transfer stations in Kyneton, Romsey and Woodend.

Council works updates

Kettlewells Road upgrades underway

Upgrades to the unsealed Kettlewells Road in Romsey are now underway, improving safety and amenity for a route commonly used by heavy vehicles.

Home to Council's awardwinning storm waste facility, the Kettlewells Gravel Pit Reserve and several rural residences, a large section of the road is set to benefit from road sealing, improved drainage and a new bus shelter at the intersection of Melbourne-Lancefield Road.

These works are funded by Emergency Management Victoria and the Kettlewells Gravel Pit Reserve, and are expected to be finished by the end of the year. Minor delays are expected for road users during the works.

Kettlewells Road is among a number of road upgrades prioritised across the shire as part of Council's 2023/24 Capital Works Program.




On Wednesday 1st November RPS held their biennial Art Show. Students got to showcase their amazing art pieces for their family and the school community to see.



Year 3 Health & Wellbeing Excursion - Kyneton Botanic Gardens

On Wednesday 25th October the students in Year 3 attended the Kyneton Botanic Gardens for a Health & Wellbeing Excursion. The purpose of the excursion was to explore the physical, mental and emotional benefits of nature and spending time outdoors. Through a playful exploration of the Kyneton Botanic Gardens, our students were encouraged to see themselves as part of the natural world and consider how being in nature could contribute to positive emotional and physical wellbeing. We began by tuning into nature with our senses, exploring with magnifying glasses, getting a close up look at nature. Listening to the sounds around us, birds singing, the wind whistling in the trees. Rubbing parts of plants between our fingers to smell the different scents as well as smelling the array of beautiful flowers on offer. We then collected what we could find in nature, leaves, gumnuts, sticks, flowers etc and explored how we could use these natural objects to make patterns. It was great to see the different patterns that students created. Using the natural objects, students were able to choose one or two to create an artwork piece. Using water colours, students drew their piece of nature and coloured it. These artworks were most impressive and students should be very proud of the works they produced.

It was a fantastic session that showed us how nature can assist us with our mental and physical wellbeing. Students were very happy to finish with a 10 minute play on the playground!

A huge thank you to staff from Melbourne's Royal Botanic Gardens for taking us for this free session.

The Truth of Christmas

Jesus told him, "I am the Way—yes, and the Truth and the Life. No one can get to the Father except by means of me." (John 14:6, Living Bible).

Spoiler alert. If Santa is part of your Christmas tradition, don't read any further.

We have never 'done' Santa in our house. You know, the bloke that brings you gifts; sees everything you do; works out whether you are naughty or nice; and on one night of the year is everywhere all at once.


That is the truth about Christmas and the one that I wanted my children to learn.




Romsey Cricket Club – December Update


