



Hasn't it been cold? I usually enjoy working in the garden even when it's cold because I rug up well. However recent weather has been even too cold for me despite thermal underwear! In 30 years, we have never really been bothered by the bunnies before; but now the wretches are visiting every night and chewing and digging up my new plants! Grrrr!

I have spent every spare moment planting – trying to get the plants in the ground before autumn ended. I was mostly successful. The new garden as been landscaped to a plan and has no lawn (planning for ageing in place and not being able to mow one day).

Large areas of Lancefield toppings are surrounded by shrub beds mulched with pine bark. A large central mound made from mixing a three-way mix with sand will provide excellent drainage for my succulent collection. Bordering it is a dry creek bed with a rustic timber bridge.

Out the back near the rainwater tank I have my little greenhouse and the vegetable growing area with raised vegetable beds. Also, the storage of pots, potting mix and other bits and pieces. A large screen has been erected from concreting reinforcing mesh against the west facing wall and I have sown sweet peas in front of it for this spring. Next year I might try something different. Between the house and the shed is a small courtyard featuring a central water feature and bluestone steppers. This will eventually be shaded by a Chinese elm. The clothesline is on the west wall of the shed and is screened so you can't see it. A carport houses the two cars and our new gate of corten steel features cut-outs of the grass that grows on our land after which our home is named -Danthonia.





# Brooks Falls Brown Bears -Katmai National Park in Alaska

Have you ever heard or Otis, Chunk, 801, Holly or 747? These are some of the Brown Bears from Brooks Falls in Alaska. In early July of every year, people from all around the world tune in to the solar power cameras that are set up on the falls, to see how well the Brown Bears have survived their hibernation.

The Brown Bears wake from hibernation and begin arriving at the falls in late June for the annual salmon spawning up the Brooks River in Katmai National Park. Just about everyone has their favourite bear and are keen to make sure they have arrived at the falls.

The salmon spawning is a huge event in the year for the Brown Bears. Many have lost well over 60% of their body weight during hibernation and the salmon provide a massive supply of easily accessible high protein.

Yearlings and cubs from the hibernation also come with their mothers and often sisters help look after each other's cubs. Many a male has discovered it is not wise to come between a mother and her cub.

Every year viewers get to vote on the bear that has put on the most weight over the July - September period. Pictures of the top bears, July and September, are on the website to help with the vote.

www.explore.org is the wonderful website where this amazing wildlife activity can be found. Just look for; brown bears, Katmai Alaska, or scroll through all the other sites that are on offer; polar bears, puffins, orcas, African wildlife, live nest cams etc.

As we move through our daily lives we regularly see examples of unique flora and fauna. What can we do to highlight these wonderful plants and animals and maybe to get some of these amazing creatures and plants on to this inspiring site?

# Celebrating Schools Tree Day 2024 at Romsey Primary

On Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July, Romsey Primary School and Deep Creek Landcare Group worked together planting pollinator species as part of the Junior Landcare White Ave Pollinator Project that began in 2020. The students, teachers, parents, and landcare group volunteers worked together as a fantastic crew, managing to plant and tree-guard ALL 600 plants by the end of the day.

We had: 8 adults, 600 plants, 300 tree guards and stakes,100 students, lots of cold wind and drizzle, surprise chocolate treats and 100% fantastic attitudes and planting skills!


The plants were paid for by grant money from Planet Ark and tree-guarding materials were donated from Deep Creek Landcare Group. Additionally, 100 plants were donated by the group so that each student could take home one to plant as a memento of the day. The Deep Creek Landcare Group also awarded each student with a book of their choice to take home. The books were funded by a grant from the Lancefield and Romsey Community Bank.

Deep Creek Landcare Network's Junior Landcare Facilitator, Emma Stevens organized the day. Emma works with the local schools to help educate our young minds to understand ecosystems, the importance of looking after our environment and the benefits of "getting our hands dirty".

With the school in recent years, we have planted blackwood wattles, tea tree, silver banksias, dogwood and correas. This year the task was to add more mid-storey and lower-storey pollinator species. Wattles such as: prickly moses, golden, hedge and gold dust were chosen along with hop bush, grevillea rosmarinifolia, bush pea, bacon and egg bush and paper daisies. Important grasses like poa, lomandra, kangaroo and dianella were added along the border.

On the last day of Keep Australia Beautiful Week, Sunday August 11 we conducted the second of our twice-yearly clean ups. In addition to a number of sites around Lancefield we cleaned up the southern end of Knox Road in Romsey. Across the sites we easily filled a large, caged trailer with discarded rubbish. In March next year in conjunction with Clean-Up Australia Day we are hoping to enlist more volunteers and expand our clean up. Ideas would be greatly appreciated and remember cans, bottles and other eligible containers can be taken to the Container Deposit Scheme depot at 8 Mitchell Ct in Romsey. Proceeds can be directed to Deep Creek Landcare if you would like to support us.

Deep Creek Landcare Group has nesting boxes for bats, birds and phascogales for sale from \$30. We also have Myna bird traps to lend out. Annual Landcare membership is \$20 per family. ### PAW PAW

Paw paws, or papaya, as some people call them, grow in abundance in Queensland. The paw paw is a fruit, of course, which most people eat but there are some people who make a paste of paw paw and rub it on lumbago, ingrown toenails, lumps, bumps, bites and all sorts of things.

No doubt you already know paw paws grow on trees. But you may not know that there are female trees and male trees and, if you'll pardon the expression, one male tree services eight female trees, and the female trees not only have to put up with that, but bear fruit as well.

Paw Paw is also a meat tenderiser as well as a fruit and it's particularly good for you because it's rich in Vitamin A, B, B1 and C. But not only is it a meat tenderiser (*like the Kiwi Fruit*) it's also a very good digestive. Most countries, for instance, eat the little black pips. Most Australians throw them away. So next time you have paw paw, eat the pips and banish indigestion naturally. As well as being rich in vitamins and digestive qualities, paw paw is full of dietary fibre, also the enzyme called papain which decomposes protein. So if you're cooking a couple of old shins or gravy beef or something, cut up some paw paw, throw it in with the shins or whatever and it'll tenderise them.

You can even tenderise with paw paw leaves as the Chinese do. They might have an old boiler (an old chook not the missus), and to tenderise it, I'm told, they simply hang it in a paw paw tree.

I'm sure you know without me telling you that ripe paw paws you eat raw for breakfast or dessert or with the roast, and green ones you cook.

So here goes with a recipe.

#### **STUFFED PAW PAW**

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 2 tablespoons butter
- 250 g minced steak
- 1 medium sized white onion, finely chopped
- 1 clove garlic, crushed
- · pinch of cumin
- freshly ground black pepper
- 1 firm green paw paw
- 1 cup blanched almonds
- whole strawberries and sprig of mint for garnish

#### METHOD

- 1. Melt half the butter in a large, heavy frying pan, throw in the minced steak, onion, crushed garlic, three quarters of the cup of blanched almonds (keep the other quarter to sprinkle over the finished product), and sprinkle with the cumin and some freshly ground black pepper. Saute until the meat is just cooked.
- 2. Peel the paw paw, cut off the top and take out the pips so that you have a hollow right through the centre. Stuff the hollow with the meat mixture, put the rest of the butter on top and stand it in a buttered, ovenproof dish.
- 3. Put the paw paw into the oven and bake at 180c for about an hour, basting from time to time with the butter and juices from the meat and the paw paw.
- 4. Decorate with a few whole strawberries and some sprigs of fresh mint and take to the table. Cut into thick slices, sprinkle with the rest of the almonds and serve hot.








**HEAVY WINDS BRING DOWN A TREE**: Heavy winds are not uncommon at RGC. On Wednesday July 24 they were strong enough to bring down a medium sized pine tree. No-one was within 100m of the tree when it fell. Steady work by our volunteers saw the timber cut up, some going to the odd *"Man Cave"* and smaller branches going to the burn-off pile.

#### Gambling Harm Prevention Policy

At its July 2024 Council Meeting, Council deferred consideration of the Draft Gambling Harm Prevention Policy to the 28 August 2024 Council Meeting, allowing officers additional time to meet with potentially impacted parties and further explain the Draft Policy and its implications.

Officers have since developed a fact sheet to clearly outline some of the key statements within the Policy, the implications of these and examples where practical.

#### Examples of these key Policy statements include:

- guidance around Council support where a group is also being financially supported by an entity with gambling revenue; and
- working with sporting and community groups to support them in delivering gambling-free environments.

The Draft Policy is also proposed to be renamed to the Gambling Harm Minimisation Policy.

#### Annual tree planting and elm leaf beetle programs to get underway

Council will soon begin its annual street tree planting and elm leaf beetle treatment programs, to improve and protect the Macedon Ranges' natural environment.

Under the street tree planting program, a different town in the shire is typically prioritised each year, depending on available budget. Carefully selected tree species are planted at strategically chosen locations along streets to enhance a town's landscapes.

Acting Director Assets and Operations, Simon Finlay, said Kyneton would be prioritised for street tree planting this year, with planting set to occur between August and September - the cooler months giving the trees the best opportunity of establishing through the following summer.

From new trees, to existing trees; the Macedon Ranges is home to a significant and healthy population of about 2,400 elm trees. This year, elm trees in Romsey and Lancefield will be the focus of Council's elm leaf beetle treatment program which will commence in the coming weeks.

The treatment will ensure that the elm trees in these areas are protected from damage and defoliation caused by the elm leaf beetle and remain healthy and vibrant.

The elm leaf beetle feeds on the leaves of elm trees, leaving distinctive round holes which, if left untreated, can severely weaken the trees, leading to reduced visual appeal, safety concerns and a shortened lifespan.

Treatment includes spraying and injecting the soil around the tree's root zone with low-toxicity insecticide. This safe and effective method protects the trees for up to three years.








# Giving Young People the Facts They Need to Stop Vaping



The State Government is backing a new initiative that will see local councils, universities, sporting clubs and community organisations join forces to help stop young people vaping.

Minister for Health Mary-Anne Thomas announced a \$2 million investment to deliver workshops, community events, and develop a peer-to-peer digital platform for young people aged 14 to 25 – to educate young people about the harms of vaping. The two-year project is being delivered by the Victorian Health Promotion Foundation (*VicHealth*) in partnership with UNCLOUD.

UNCLOUD is a digital platform which provides peer-reviewed and scientifically backed information about vaping and allows young people to share their stories with each other.

More than 30 local councils, including Macedon Ranges, five sporting teams, and five universities will join the project by sharing the UNCLOUD platform at community events and activations.

As part of the project, the Alcohol and Drug Foundation will upskill coaches at sporting clubs across Victoria with anti-vaping education.

The Victorian Government will continue to work with the Commonwealth and other states and territories on the implementation of the Therapeutic Goods and Other Legislation Amendment (*Vaping Reforms*) Bill 2024.

Banning retail sales and making vapes available only through pharmacies will ultimately keep vapes out of children's hands.

Ten years ago I saw a tram hit a man and I became a witness, without offering to be. I remember how annoying it was, that next time I saw an incident, I'd run away to avoid anyone getting my details.

Also a while ago, I was in a car accident where the other driver was at fault – but there was no direct proof. Then, I had three strong witnesses who came to my aid and did all they could so justice was done. I was overwhelmed and humbled by their generosity - I may not have done the same thing in their situation. Realising what a difference they made in my life, I determined to be helpful next time I had the chance.




