NOVEMBER IN THE GARDEN

Such a windy spring we have had! I have lost several trunks on my multi-trunked mallee tree and enough twigs and leaves to carpet all the gravel areas! Mallee trees by their very nature are multi-trunked and I'm sure the wind plays a process in weeding out the growths that are less strongly attached. However, it's still sad to lose anything in the garden.

I retired from full-time work a few weeks ago and it's been great to be able to spend day after day in my garden – especially during spring! I have been fertilising a lot of plants as it is their first year in the ground and I want them to get off to a good start. I have also been weeding, installing some garden art and potting up cuttings.

The Virginia creeper growing up the verandah posts has come into leaf and is already rocketing away with new growth. I will have to spend the next few months regularly training it in the right direction.

I am excited to announce that a chance apricot coloured seedling from Acacia leprosa 'Scarlet Blaze' that came up in my garden 7 years ago has finally been released onto the market! It is called 'Apricot Confetti' and will probably only be available in spring when it flowers (August to October). Its ball-like flowers open deep apricot and fade to a salmon-orange. I was thrilled when it first flowered in my garden – the fine leaves and haze of apricot flowers looked gorgeous! My tree is in the middle of a reasonably dense planting where it receives shelter and support on all sides.



This is not destined to be a stand-alone specimen tree so plant it with other plants. With its graceful semi-weeping habit and being drought and frost tolerant this small acacia should do well in the Macedon Ranges. Look for it or order it next spring from your local nursery!

Heart Disease

I'm too young, it couldn't happen to me... could it?

Just about everyone sees Heart
Disease as a problem for those in later
life. This may be incorrect, as local Justine
O'Loughlin(37 Yrs) can testify.

Justine has two children. She leads an active life and has been careful with her diet. She is heavily involved in junior sport in the local community.

Justine and her partner Shannon were away for the weekend. Suddenly, late Saturday afternoon, she became short of breath, developed leg cramps and found her ankles beginning to swell.

RR; What happened next?

JUSTINE; Early Sunday morning we packed and headed home. I knew I was sick, and things were not right,. I had a real wheeze and soon I was gasping for air. By mid morning on Monday it got far more serious and we called an ambulance. Shannon, at work, rang the neighbours and eight came round to help. In seven minutes the ambulance arrived, did an EGG and saw my heart was "way out of wack". We rushed to hospital with sirens and lights flashing.

Over the next five days they took two litres of fluid from my heart and lungs, and found several micro clots we didn't know of. The fluid had caused the ultra-sound to be unclear. My heart rate was 132 and my blood pressure was 184/134. I was put onto medication via a drip and given oxygen to help me breathe.

Over the next few days I thought all was reasonably well until, at 4.00am on Friday morning, I woke to nurses around me and the defibrillator in action. I had had 20 irregular heartbeats in a row; 22 was a cardiac arrest and very slim chances of coming out of it. A very near thing!

I had an angiogram before I left hospital that showed no clots and no blockages... and I had lost over six Kg. RR; Justine, have you ever smoked.

JUSTINE; Yes, I was a weekend, social smoker. I gave up over seven years ago when I was pregnant with Coda, my 2nd child.

RR; Is there history of heart disease in your family?

JUSTINE; I knew a few people in the family had died young. I didn't know these deaths were related to heart disease, Angina and Transthyretin amyloidosis (ATTR-CM) occurs when your liver produces faulty transthyretin (TTR) proteins

RR; So, Justine what would people learn from your frightening experience?

JUSTINE; In hospital the doctors went through the symptoms of heart disease. I recognised most of them from my own life. I was completely unaware! Such as:

- · grabbing the chest,
- · increasing shortness of breath,
- increase in anxiety, things that would usually not bother you becoming problem,
- waking in a fright, during the night,
- · waking up and feeling tired,
- being low in energy, feeling like taking a nap,
- constantly feeling like you are on high alert.

Heart disease is a massive killer, far too many people, me included, do not know enough about it. It is up to all of us to educate ourselves about the symptoms, when to act, seek advice or call an ambulance

There is no time when it is too early to act but there can be a time when it is too late.

COOKING WITH PETER RUSSELL-CLARKE

A ROSE SHOULD SMELL SO SWEET

My wife, Jan, a north of England girl, often laughs as she tells of when, as a schoolgirl, she left the shores of England to visit a pen friend in France and, on visiting a Museum of Art, was struck by the stench of Garlic emanating from the French guards who had finished their lunch and so polluted the air with their breath. "In Lancashire we didn't use anything as a flavour enhancer stronger than salt'n'pepper."

But now she's a devout advocate of the 'stinking rose' as the garlic bulb is known.

Mind you, as a boy growing up in Tumut we had no Art Museum with Neopolitan guards to breath on and discolour the varnish of the paint, either in frames or on window sills or door frames. So it's only as time passed and our palates grew up that I've become a devotee of garlic and so pass on this Aioli recipe for your approval.

AIOLI. (GARLIC MAYONNAISE)

INGREDIENTS

- · 2 large egg yolks
- 300 ml olive oil
- 3 large cloves of garlic
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice

salt

METHOD

- Crush the garlic cloves with a pinch of salt and beat them into the two egg yolks in a bowl till they're well mixed. Still beating, add the olive oil a little at a time, making sure that it's being thoroughly absorbed into the mixture. When you've used about half the oil, add the lemon juice (a little at a time) and then, still beating, the rest of the oil again, slowly till the aioli is thick and smooth. Store as you would any other mayonnaise.
- Aioli is traditionally served alongside Mediterranean fish soups, but it's also excellent with other foods such as eggs, fish, vegetables, salads - in fact anything you would use a mayonnaise with.

ROAST GARLIC WITH THYME

INGREDIENTS

- 6 large heads of garlic
- salt
- 100 ml olive oil
- 6 sprigs of fresh thyme

METHOD

- With a sharp knife, cut off the top third of each head
 of garlic and trim off the roots at the other end. Pack
 the heads tightly, cut side up, in a single layer in an
 ovenproof dish. Drizzle with the olive oil and sprinkle
 with salt then tuck in the sprigs of thyme between the
 garlic heads. Roast, uncovered, in a pre-heated oven
 (200 deg.C) for about an hour until the garlic is soft.
- You can serve them as a 'starter' with crusty bread and a soft cheese, or as an accompaniment to any other food. You just squeeze out the cooked garlic cloves with your fingers.

NO HE DOESN'T USE A GARLIC PRESS, HE JUST BREATHS ON THE FOOD

Is your pool or spa barrier compliant?

In accordance with Victorian Law, as a pool or spa owner you must ensure the safety barriers comply with the requirements of the Building Regulations 2018.

To ensure compliance you must:

- organise an inspection of your pool barrier by a registered swimming pool inspector
- rectify any issues identified from you pool or spa inspection and obtain Certificate of Barrier Compliance (CBC, also known as a Form 23)
- lodge the CBC to Council via the online portal and pay the lodgement fee by the nominated due date.

If you own a pool or spa, it is your obligation to have the barrier inspected every four years and submit the CBC to Council by the due date.

SEASONAL FIRE PREVENTION WORKS STARTING AHEAD OF SUMMER

Annual fire prevention activities in Council-managed areas are ramping up in coming weeks, aiming to keep grass low and trees a safe distance away from powerlines.

Council's roadside grass slashing program is already underway, while an electric line vegetation clearance program is set to begin next week. Additionally, private property inspections targeting potential fire risks will commence in early November.

CEO Bernie O'Sullivan said contractors started roadside grass slashing in Malmsbury and would be gradually working their way south, to provide initial coverage of the shire.

"This program prioritises high-use Council-managed roads and our contractors work within strict guidelines to complete these works safely," he said.

"Cutting grass on these roadsides, combined with other activities such as the powerline clearance works and property inspections, is all part of our efforts to proactively protect our townships and residents ahead of the higher-risk fire season."

In the lead up to summer, and during summer when safe, Council slashes roadsides to reduce the likelihood of fires starting from hot vehicle exhausts, mechanical failures and collisions. Transport Victoria manages the roadside maintenance of state-managed roadsides.

Council is responsible for keeping powerlines clear of vegetation on nature strips and Council-owned properties within declared areas of Gisborne and Kyneton. Powercor is responsible for most other non-declared areas of the shire, with Jemena responsible for Gisborne South.

As part of the program, qualified arborists inspect street trees and powerlines to identify potential breaches of clearance guidelines and organise trimming where appropriate, adhering to Council's Electric Line Clearance Management Plan 2024-25.


Council's Municipal Fire Prevention Officers will also soon be conducting private property inspections to check for fire hazards such as unmaintained long grass, excessive woodpiles or other debris.

Officers may issue Fire Prevention Notices where necessary. If a property owner does not comply, they may face an infringement of nearly \$2,000, plus any costs associated with completing the required works.

"Our officers don't seek to fine people – we would prefer to work collaboratively with property owners and help safeguard their property," Mr O'Sullivan said. "However, we also have a broader responsibility to protect our towns and support residents who are doing the right thing."

ROMSEY TOWN CENTRE ACTION PLAN UPDATE

The Romsey Town Centre Action Plan Team continues to enthusiastically work on Action Plan (https://easternmacedonranges.au/s/240508_Romsey-action-plan-FINAL2.pdf) projects as follows:

- *Main Street Lighting*: Stage 1 of this project involves the proposal to illuminate 40 Main Street trees with solar lights. - *Murals*: A number of privately owned sites have been earmarked for Stage 1 of the Murals project. Engagement with property owners is ongoing, and the theme for the artwork is being developed. Funding opportunities are also being explored.
- *Signage*: The Action team is organising a draft concept for wayfinding signage that would support awareness of local businesses (as an alternative to A-frames) and other landmark sites/resources. The concept will be presented to local business operators for feedback before being discussed with Macedon Ranges Shire Council.
- Roundabout: The Barry Street roundabout was noted in the Town Centre Action Plan as a key "town centre entry point" enhancement opportunity. Action team members recently met on-site with Scott Gilchrist (Council's Acting Manager Parks, Recreation and Depots) to discuss the potential for improved aesthetics and the possibility of a future feature inclusion in the roundabout (consistent with Action Plan suggested themes). As a result of the discussion, Scott has suggested some extra support for the current plantings as well as some extra "infill" plantings this Spring to boost the landscaping before Summer. In addition, he was supportive of the Action Team developing

some concept ideas for a central "feature" that could be presented to Department of Transport and Council.

There are many other initiatives (big and small) identified in the Romsey Town Centre Action Plan just waiting to be activated. For more information or if you would like to assist this great group of local "do-ers" in the Action Team, email contact@easternmacedonranges.au.

Fire prevention works in the shire

Property inspections

Council's Municipal Fire Prevention Officers have begun inspecting properties around the shire and will be issuing notices to landowners that require fuel reduction works to be completed.

Officers will be checking for fire hazards such as unmaintained long grass, excessive woodpiles or other debris. Officers may issue Fire Prevention Notices where necessary. If a property owner does not comply, they may face an infringement of nearly \$2,000 plus any costs associated with completing the required works.

If you plan on bailing grass and receive a notice, please let us know by completing the application for extension on the back of the notice. If you are grazing stock, you must demonstrate that the number is sufficient to reduce the risk, and if not, you may be required to do additional fuel reduction work.

Road Maintenance Blitz Revs up Across Regional Victoria

The State Government is rolling out a major road maintenance blitz to rebuild, repair, and resurface roads right across Victoria – fuelled by the largest single-year investment in road maintenance in the state's history.

Minister for Roads and Road Safety Melissa Horne recently launched the \$964 million road maintenance blitz at the South Geelong depot of Fulton Hogan, one of the contractors that will deliver these works between now and mid-2025.

An army of road workers will begin delivering the equivalent of \$2.6 million worth of works for every day of the year – with around 70 per cent of funding going to regional Victoria.

Over the next nine months, crews will complete thousands of projects on our network, ranging from road rehabilitation and resurfacing, to patching potholes and maintaining bridges, traffic lights, signage and road infrastructure.

To deliver major works such as road rebuilding and rehabilitation, there must be extended periods of warmer and drier conditions, which is why most work is done between now and May each year - ensuring repairs last.

IN MACEDON THE FOLLOWING ROADS ARE INCLUDED:

- · Gisborne-Kilmore Road
- Tylden-Woodend Road
- · Kilmore-Lancefield Road
- · Heathcote-Kyneton Road

WITH ROADS NEARBY INCLUDING:

- Vineyard Road Sunbury
- Midland Hwy between Blampied and Newlyn
- Bendigo Redesdale Road.

Repeated flooding and above-average rainfall caused unprecedented damage to our roads which meant our maintenance program needed to focus on rebuilding damaged roads last year – simply resurfacing these roads would not have prevented further degradation.



CAN WE BE NATURE POSITIVE?

Global warming, climate change and climate anxiety can be overwhelming. So economists talking about "nature positive" is encouraging – not just GDP, CPI, the NAIRU. We know the world has changed.



Economics and the environment are being linked. The 2021 World Economic Forum in 2021 called for the world to become net zero and nature positive for people and the planet. Nature positive means enhancing planet resilience, to halt and reverse nature loss. It is disruptive ie. to think about our place in the world.

Economists have now recognized the importance of "natural capital": the world's stock of natural assets, such as geology, soil, air, water and all living things."1 Ken Henry (former Treasury secretary) says that "the historical loss of natural capital denies us reason to believe that future generations will have the capacity to achieve our level of wellbeing.... It is irrational to suppose that we are custodians of sustainable development."1He argues for nature repair, so much has been lost ...we must become nature positive!

The first global nature positive summit was in Sydney recently, hosted by Tanya Plibersek, Minister for the Environment. Terrific, but what nature positive action is taking place now?

Deep Creek Landcare and environmental groups work with local, state and federal government on nature positive projects. Six Macedon Ranges Biolinks and more indigenous plants along creeks, roadways, parks etc will enhance resilience. Also, recycling at Romsey Tip, cat curfews, brumby control, less native logging, ending professional fishing in bays and lakes and breeding programs for critically endangered flora and fauna are a few.

In Melbourne, Moonee Ponds Creek is a living creek not the sterile concrete drain of the 1970's. Project Cultivate at Melbourne Cemetery plants natives and grasses to revitalise the site, intending to expand to the program. Much more can be done; ending duck hunting, more environmental flows to rivers and creeks and less light pollution spring to mind.

Rewiring to electrify Australian with renewable energy is vital. As ageing coal fired power stations close, the Government aims for 82% renewable energy by 2030. More can be done if we look. Growth of Lancefield and Romsey could direct stormwater from new developments into wetlands - part of beautiful parklands, a nature stronghold that filters water before it enters our waterways. Can we be Nature Positive? Have you got ideas for us?

Deep Creek Landcare Group has nesting boxes for bats, birds and phascogales for sale from \$25. We also have Myna bird traps to lend out. Annual Landcare membership is \$20 per family. Safe Socials will be delivered in schools as a resource for students, teachers and families about how to navigate social media.

72 hours after an emergency event: community-led resilience plans

Council has been working with seven communities in the Macedon Ranges providing support enabling readiness in the first 72 hours after an emergency event has occurred.

The Victorian Government has provided funding to local governments to assist communities to be aware of local services available to them prior to emergency activations.

'Community Readiness' can be as much as understanding who can provide immediate short-term accommodation and food and water services, as well as who is available to assist with communications and power back-up like generators.

Communities are creating individual documents outlining who and what is available locally with contact information accessible by the Emergency Management team at Council, which can assist if power and communication are impacted.

Following the 2019-20 Black Summer fires and 2022 floods, it was identified that communities themselves are the best supporters of community mmediately after an emergency, and that when a community is prepared for an emergency, support can be offered immediately.

Roadside maintenance

Did you know that each year Council slashes around 1,000 km of roadsides for fire prevention?

Fires can start on roadsides due to hot vehicle exhausts, mechanical failures and collisions. We slash high-use roadsides to reduce the chances of these incidents resulting in a fire. Typically, 80 per cent of traffic uses 20 per cent of our roads, so those roads are targeted as a priority.

Council contractors have commenced roadside slashing in Malmsbury and will gradually work their way south, to provide initial coverage of the shire.



Zonta Says NO to Violence

Monday November 25 is the International Day for the elimination of violence against women and December 10 is Human Rights Day. The 16 days that begin and end on these dates are recognised internationally as the '16 Days of Activism' to prevent violence against women.

Violence against women has an impact on communities throughout Australia. On average, one woman a week is murdered by her current or former partner and intimate partner violence is the leading cause of death, disability and illness for Australian women aged 18-44 years.

The Zonta Club of Kyneton will work with Macedon Ranges Shire and with other community groups to raise awareness of gender-based violence, challenge discriminatory attitudes and encourage community-based support for those living with violence, through a program of activities.

In Kyneton, the Zonta Club will have a display in the community window in Mollison Street, and across the Shire, the club will work with local libraries to highlight the impact of violence against women. In Woodend, the Zonta Club will support financial workshops that will be held at the Woodend Neighbourhood House as a part of the 16 Days of Activism.



FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR TIM

| Remembrance

Monday the 11th of November is Remembrance Day – make sure you come along to the Lancefield Cenotaph for the RSL Service starting at 10:45am. On that day, we not only remember the signing of the Armistice at the end of World War I, but we also remember the lives sacrificed in the service of our country, and those traumatised and injured in conflict. Remembrance should also be a time of reflecting on the lessons learned from conflict and the terrible toll it takes, although sadly it seems that as a world we still haven't got there yet.

The bible asks us to undertake an act of remembrance. Jesus at the Last Supper asked that His followers take the bread, to signify His body, and the cup of wine, representing His blood, in remembrance of Him. Or as the Amplified translation puts it, "Do this in [affectionate] remembrance of Me." (1 Corinthians 11:24).

It is "affectionate remembrance" as we realise the great cost to Jesus of our wrongdoing and that through what He did, we can be saved and have a joyous relationship with God. Part of this remembrance that we call communion is reflecting on where we have come from and where Jesus has brought us to, so hopefully we are also learning the lessons from our past.



Dog walkers reminded to do the right thing

Council's Local Laws officers are increasing their presence at popular dog walking locations, in response to strong community support for more enforcement in this area.

Council continuously receives community complaints regarding dog walkers ignoring the on-leash requirements and failing to pick up after their dog.

In January 2020, Council became an on-leash shire, meaning dogs in public places must be on a leash, except in designated off-leash areas. (Note: all footpaths in the shire are dog on-leash, even those in designated off-leash areas. This is to ensure the safety of other footpath users including pedestrians, cyclists and others).

It is also a legal requirement to pick up after your dog and to carry bags – or a suitable device – for the collection of dog poo from your dog.

Dog walkers not adhering to these requirements risk on-the-spot fines.

Local Laws officers will be enforcing both the dog on-leash and dog poo collection requirements. The current fine amount for walking your dog off leash in an on-leash area is \$198, while the fine for not picking up after your dog or for failing to carry a dog poo bag with you is \$395.

If out walking your dog, please do the right thing. Remember to take your dog poo bags with you and adhere to the dog on leash areas to avoid a fine.


